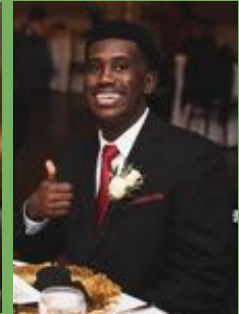
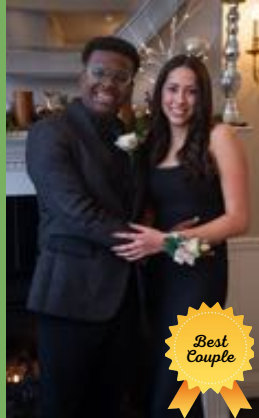

Grades 2 & 3 Visit Norcross Wildlife Center



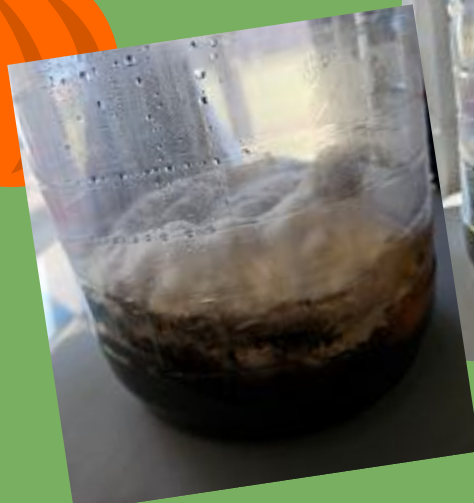
