
### **Graduation Weekend**

Inigo's "love is the Care" Cancer Journey

On Saturday, May 20, Inigo lost his battle with medulloblastoma.

At the start of the pandemic, Inigo began homeschooling, but he has always been considered to be a part of SLA's Class of 2030. There hadn't been any update on Inigo's Go Fund Me Page for over a month.

#### On May 26, Alfonso wrote the following:

"I have dreaded needing to write this update.

Inigo passed away on May 20, 2023, at 3:33 AM. Inigo slept for 11 days before he took his last breath and he died 11 days before his 11th birthday. His body rested on the Day of Rest. Inigo kept fighting until it simply did not make sense to fight any longer but, what a fighter he was. He could give lessons to all of us on what it means to persevere in life. He did live well. He always wore a sweet smile and even while sick cared more about how you were doing. He is a Legend...

He fought so hard but fighting cancer means so many things. You don't get to pick the cancer that you get and with brain and spinal cancers, space means time. Because the tumors were enclosed in the skull and spinal column, Inigo had run out of space, which meant that he had run out of time...

Finally, Inigo turned to Lyndi as we sat on the rooftop garden at Boston Children's Hospital on a beautiful afternoon and asked her the question, "Mom, would it be selfish if I said that I don't want to do this anymore?"

No sweet boy, it is not selfish in fact we were just amazed at how hard you pushed yourself through this journey. All you ever wanted was to be better, to get better. As always, Inigo was intelligent far beyond his years. Inigo realized that he was not going to get better. He was tired, he was sick of being sick. He was sad about having cancer, his smile was slowly starting to fade even though he didn't want it to. In those final days, those tumors in his brain wreaked havoc on Inigo in so many ways and yet he was still able to enjoy bowls of ice cream and whoopie pies. He dipped his Madeleine's into his morning hot chocolate. He did, I guess, what is called a "Tim Tam slam" with some Australian Tim Tams. He ate plates of his favorite nachos and polished off his evenings with popcorn and a movie. We walk away absolutely in love with him, amazed by him, in awe of his strength, and thankful and humbled that we got to be his parents...

There is so much more that I want to write but I cannot at the moment. Lyndi and I love Inigo more than any words will ever express. One day, I will write a lot more about this entire journey. And the amazing story of Inigo Anton Vega, quite possibly the strongest Vega ever.

There will not be a funeral service for Inigo. However in a couple of months in the fall, we will have a celebration of life for him. That is what Inigo would've wanted so we will have just that, a celebration of who he was. Cancer doesn't define Inigo's story but it sure amplifies his strengths and we want to celebrate his journey."

Please remember to keep Inigo's family in your prayers as they go through this difficult time.

Preschool, Pre Kindergarten, Kindergarten, 1st Grade, 2nd Grade, 4th Grade, 9th Grade, and 10th Grade.


