Thank you for being a part of our SLA family and have a restful and blessed Sabbath.




7th and 8th graders help out the Greater Lancaster Holiday Food Drive by assembling brownbag packets to be passed out to the community.

- PARENT ALERT is a mass notification system comprised of text messaging, voice calls and email. It is designed to send messages to thousands of individuals in minutes. In cases of emergencies, Parent Alert provides instantaneous communication to the school community. It is very important that you keep your information updated at the school. Please do not call the teachers, administrators or staff.
 - In bad weather when it is unsafe to drive to school, parents can expect teachers to conduct class remotely and/or provide "blizzard packs."
 - Communication is very important to keep learning uninterrupted.
 - Please be aware that "Snow Days" are automatic "Remote Days". All grades, Preschool-12th grade, will zoom whenever weather prevents safe travel to school and a snow day is called.
