

Boys' Volleyball in the Spring


Will there be, or will there not be a boys' volleyball team in the spring? It all depends on the level of interest, so if you're interested, please let Mr. DeOliveira know!





Inigo's "love is the Care" Cancer Journey

SLA has been following, sharing, and supporting Inigo's fight against medulloblastoma. Despite homeschooling since the start of the pandemic, Inigo will always be a part of our SLA Class of 2030 (currently in 5th Grade).

In September 2021 Inigo was diagnosed with high-risk medulloblastoma. He underwent a brain tumor resection then began radiation followed by chemotherapy. Due to the brain surgery, Inigo developed Posterior Fossa Syndrome or Cerebellar Mutism. A year later, in September 2022, Inigo began another course of chemotherapy to treat the metastatic brain tumor. His parents have left their jobs to help Inigo with his journey. They have started a gofundme.

This Shirt campaign, https://www.bonfire.com/inigos-posse/ is an opportunity for people to share in something tangible from Inigo's family, and to be a part of their story by showing support for Inigo. Inigo helped his dad create this design while at Spaulding Rehabilitation. It was a portrait of Inigo as a line sketch that Inigo had started working on a few years ago.

When students/parents purchase shirts, the shirts are sent out in batches every 10 days.


Joint Worship

Grades P-12 Parent Teacher Conference Sign Up is now OPEN! Sign Up is on a first come, first serve basis. The sooner you click through the link, the more time slots will be available to you.



The FAFSA application uses tax information from 2021 so there is no need to wait on your 2022 tax returns. Most colleges have some aid awarded on a first come first serve basis, so don't wait!
