Founder's Corner - Special Issue



Some may be surprised to learn that Ellen White herself has ties to SLA. Not only was she a close friend of its founder, Elder Haskell, but she visited the Academy more than once. Most amazingly, spiritual revival started here during meetings in 1888, in response to the Christ Our Righteousness message. She even described the experience as seeming to "breathe in the very atmosphere of heaven."

The words she had for SLA's students in 1885 still ring true today: "To the students of South Lancaster Academy I would say: 'Draw nigh to God, and He will draw nigh to you.' Never be ashamed of your faith; never be found on the side of the enemy. 'Ye are the light of the world.' Your faith is to be revealed as precious truth, truth which all should have and all must have if they are saved. As a people, we are in the

minority. We are not popular. Our enemies will be watching us for evil, to betray us and to rruin our souls. They will not appreciate our motives. They will misinterpret our earnest zeal and our intense desire to have others see and understand the truth, that they may do the will of God by obeying all His commandments. But we should fight he good fight of faith, and be found 'steadfast, unmovable, always aboutnind in teh wrok of the Lord."


We cannot wait to share what we have been planning. It's going to be a great time! Everyone's invited. So put it on your calendar and we will see you soon!!


